Fast and furiously, students in English 9, English 10, and AIMS Reading are increasing their vocabulary. Students are learning prefixes and roots to help decode words during reading. In just the last three weeks, they have been exposed to, and are putting into practice, 30 college level words and 55 words with the prefixes *pre-*, *post-*, and *mono-*, and the root words *ped* and *man/manu*. In pre-algebra, we are exploring data analysis. The students are learning how to interpret data and display it mathematically and graphically. Each lesson and activity is aligned to the Arizona Academics Standard and relative to the AIMS materials.

There are several noteworthy upcoming projects, which will involve obtaining an unknown bacterial specimen from the wilderness and controlling the growth on nutrient agar/trypticase soy agar plates as well as observing the phototaxis and locomotion of brown planarians.

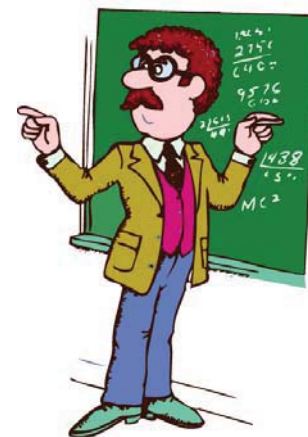
