Cox Charities Supports Transitional Living Program for At-Risk Girls – Awards Florence Crittenton \$10,000

PHOENIX – Florence Crittenton was awarded a \$10,000 grant from Cox Charities that will help support the organization’s Transitional Living Program for girls aging out of the state’s foster care system.

Program participants are provided individualized case management services from Florence Crittenton staff. Girls can stay in the program for up to 24 months, during which time they are learning valuable independent living skills that will prepare them to live successfully on their own in the future.

“Cox Charities’ support of Florence Crittenton’s programs is an investment in the future of young people and our community,” said Linda Volhein, Florence Crittenton’s Executive Director. “We feel very grateful for this special relationship, and we are proud to have them as friends.”

Cox Charities was established in 1996 to raise money for the communities in which Cox Communications Arizona operates. It awards grants on an annual basis to Arizona non-profit organizations. Money is raised yearlong through fundraising events and employee contributions. To date, grants made to community charities have topped one million dollars.
